# How to Use the Bible Memory Canvas

1. Write your name, Scripture reference, and verse numbers in the spaces provided.
2. Identify the “Nails” in each verse. “Nail” refers to a key word that makes the verse memorable. It “nails” it down into your memory. A “Nail” might be a name, place, figure of speech, word picture, or important noun or verb.
3. Once you’ve identified your “nails” for each verse, draw and color them in the space provided.
4. Refer to this sheet as you actively memorize and review your verses.
