That you may answer **WORDS OF TRUTH** to those who send to you?"

Dear Friends of Scripture Memory,

**Peace. Love. Joy. Light. Certainty of Truth**. Consider the greatness, the sweetness, the value of a vital connection to the Lord Jesus Christ! He is the Life-giving vine; then we can become fruit-bearing branches. He nourishes us and sends us many of His gifts through His Word. "It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing. "**The words that I speak to you are spirit, and they are life**" (John 6:63)! Contrast all this with Matthew Arnold's poem "Dover Beach." Arnold, writing about 1851, could well have been speaking of our day when he compared the barrenness of Dover Beach at low-tide with the wasteland of a faithless world:

"The Sea of Faith
Was once, too, at the full, and round earth's shore...
But now I only hear its melancholy, long, withdrawing roar, retreating...
For the world...hath really neither joy, nor love, nor light,
Nor certitude, nor peace, nor help for pain;
And we are here as on a darkling plain
Swept with confused alarms of struggle and flight,
Where ignorant armies clash by night."

Does that not aptly describe our world, in all its headlong rush to reject, refute, rebut, and replace God's truth with half-truths of its own devising? When my dad launched into this ministry in 1944, the world was convulsed with the unspeakable violence of the Second World War; the need for light and truth was undeniable. But if anything, despite all our "progress," the world's darkness has deepened, and the need for God's Word in human hearts everywhere has only grown more intense. The "ignorant armies" clashing by night need not stay ignorant. The darkness need not endure! The "confused alarms of struggle and flight" may be crushed under the weight of peace, peace wrought through reconciliation with God. God's Word, entering the believing heart, brings **peace**, **love**, **joy**, **and light**.

"O LORD, revive Your work in the midst of the years . . . " (Hab. 3:2).
