"The seed is the word of God." (Luke 8:11)

Dear Friends and Family,

Christmas celebrates something stunning: Jesus Christ has come to make His home, to abide with us as Immanuel, God with us! Joy! Human history's final page looks forward to the same joy: "Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, and He will dwell with them, and they shall be His people....

And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes..." (Rev. 21:3-4). Though our story began with God living among us (Gen. 2:22; 3:8-9), human rebellion repeatedly led to terrible ichabod moments ("glory has departed"): we're banished from Paradise (Gen. 3:23-24), God's Spirit leaves us (Gen. 6:3), God's dwelling or Shekinah glory departs (1 Sam. 4:21-22; Ezek 9:3). But Jesus' coming reverses all that: Dwelling glory returns (John 1:14)! The Spirit comes to stay (John 14:16)! Paradise is regained (Luke 24:43)!

Our Lord Immanuel has indeed come to abide with us, but two questions remain: First, is He actually abiding and dwelling with you and me in particular? Second, are we abiding, living in Him? When the Son of God *in utero* came to the hometown of His father David, ironically, there was no room in the inn (Luke 2:7). They had no space for Jesus, and this symbolized the state of many hearts: "He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him. He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him" (John 1:10-11). Does the same thing happen in our lives at times? Our busyness can lead to barrenness, and our love of self, money, pleasure, and the praise of men may render us incapable of welcoming Him (2 Tim. 3:1; John 5:44; 1 John 2:15).

There is a sure way to tell if Christ abides in us, and it is this: in hearts where Christ abides, a genuine love is born. "No one has seen God at any time. If we love one another, God abides in us..." (1 John 4:12). When we truly love one another, the invisible God is seen to be living in His people! Is it any wonder then that life seems to be a school for learning to love? Is it surprising to find that over and over we come to places where love is out of our reach, where, if God is not within us, love will not endure? The truth is, we learn best in this school when it is hard or even impossible to love. In such situations, only Christ living in us enables us to love. We fall short and fail along the way, but the One who began this good work keeps working, and keeps giving us new opportunities to grow love in this school (Phil. 1:6, 9). Our great need, our great hope is that Christ will love through us, that His love will makes us its channel: "O come to us, abide IN us, our Lord Immanuel."

"And we have known and believed the love God has for us. God is love and he who abides in love abides in God, and God in him."

(1 John 4:16)
