Scripture Memory Tip: Repetition with Emphasis

Repetition is the basic building block of memorization. Yet, it's easy to get distracted or feel bored when you're saying the same phrase over and over. One way to keep your mind engaged (and thus boost the effectiveness of your memorization) is to repeat phrases while emphasizing a different word each time. Try reading this aloud, emphasizing the italicized words: "Show me Your ways, O Lord"—"Show me Your ways, O Lord" (Psa. 25:4a). Like turning a diamond to see each facet, this is a great way to meditate on what you're learning. It will also help improve your accuracy.

Memorizer Testimony: Accountability—the Missing Key!

"I have a Scripture memory partner who holds me accountable each week. In my opinion, this is the KEY to Scripture memory! There are dozens of reasons (excuses/distractions) every week I can come up with to self-justify why I didn't memorize my Scriptures. When looking for a Scripture memory partner, I was looking for someone who was experienced and had mastered the habit because I did not want someone feeling sorry for me that my week was busy or some other reason and then let me off the hook. If my week is a little crazy and by Wednesday I am not ready to recite my verses, I start to feel the accountability to clear my schedule and elevate the priority of getting my Scriptures memorized. I essentially found a great coach! Good coaches help teach, train, push, challenge, and hold their people accountable. It has been a great blessing!"

SMF Camp Update

Scripture Memory Camp is still scheduled for July 6-10, 2020! At this point, it seems likely

that Louisiana will be in Phase Three of the reopening process, which would permit us to have camp while still honoring the safety and health of all who choose to attend.



Camp is SMF's way of motivating and rewarding young memorizers. To receive a full scholarship this year, each camper must memorize the age-appropriate number of verses from *SwordGrip Old Testament: Genesis to Psalms*. For accountability, campers are also required to recite their verses to a pastor or church leader.

Our prayer is that camp produces a generation of young people who "have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus" (2 Tim. 3:15). Just imagine the lifelong impact as God's Word bears fruit in these hearts!


Songs in the Night

Jews traveling to Jerusalem for one of the three main annual Jewish festivals traditionally sang these songs on the "ascent," or the uphill road to the city. What's at Stake in the Quest to Memorize Scripture? by Jim Woychuk

Every day, we prioritize dozens of inferior activities—games, movies, Facebooking, and politics to name a few. But why is Scripture memory worth prioritizing?

Obedience—"Teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you..." (Matt. 28:20). "Observe" means "guard" or "keep." Losing God's Word mentally is the opposite of Jesus' command.

Desire—Wisdom is more precious than rubies, and "all the things you may desire cannot compare with her" (Prov. 3:15, cf. 8:19). God's words impart understanding to those who receive and believe them. Thus, they are more desirable than gold (Psa. 19:10). In fact, they're what you really want!

Prayer—Jesus links effective prayer to internalized Scripture (John 15:7). So does John (1 John 3:22). Want to strengthen your prayer life? Reverberate Scripture!

Love—The greatest command, according to Jesus, is to love God with heart, soul, and mind (Matt. 22:37-40). The passage Jesus quotes here is Deuteronomy 6:4, which is immediately followed by a call to Scripture memory: "And these words which I command you today shall be in your heart" (Deut. 6:6).

Finally, we partnered with memorizer Marquis Laughlin to host a livestream recitation of the book of Revelation on our website.

Even though this year has not taken shape according to our plans, we praise God that His agenda cannot be thwarted (Job 42:2). His ways are not only higher; they are infinitely better.
