How Nations Become Great

"How are chinquapin oak trees propagated?" Our daughter's horticulture homework taught that many trees, besides growing from seeds, can also spring from grafts and cuttings. Not so the Word of God. New life always comes from divine seed, sowed with painstaking patience (Luke 8:11-15). "He who continually goes forth weeping, bearing seed for sowing, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him" (Psa. 126:6).

For many years, God's Word was profusely planted in children's hearts. Deeprooted biblical literacy was the birthright of children across the United States. Psalm 23, the Lord's Prayer, the Ten Commandments—children knew all these, but the roots went much deeper. The Founding Fathers of the United States spoke and wrote the language of the King James Bible with staggering



ease and range. In a cabinet meeting, Lincoln once made his point by quoting an obscure verse in Judges.



Franklin spoke of borrowing money from the French using the Gibeonites in Joshua 9 as a metaphor (Kidd). Twain's Hannibal had a Sunday School contest aiming at 1000 verses! These biblical roots were the offshoot of countless patient parental hours imparting and implanting the roots of true godliness, knowledge and wisdom by the seed of God's Word.

Today, society rips out those roots with violence and vigor. High-handed decisions descending from courts lower and Supreme explode in the public square. When strong hands rip a long, deep root from the ground, the dirt flies. A public school teacher friend in Richardson, Texas, recently admitted that he felt muzzled from speaking truth to students "devoid of Christian culture." America finds itself slouching towards Europe's Gomorrah, where too many churches become mosques, museums, and malls.

So how should we respond? How should we then live, when society aims to exterminate the planting and fruit of godly generations past? We have a choice. We can mourn and moan about what is lost or we can replant. Some of those tears are appropriate in the twilight of a great civilization, but crying won't replant the precious seed. Our bounding Springer Spaniel recently uprooted (and ate) all the flourishing green pepper and corn plants in the backyard garden. We can call him "bad dog" and grieve the loss — or we can replant.

Ministries like Awana, Navigators, Bible Bee, Scripture Typer, Remember Me, Memverse, Word in the Family, Wordsowers International, SMF, and many more must pray for divine strength and resources to engage the mammoth task of planting God's Word in vast unreached fields of this generation.
